



How Long Is the Waitlist?

We understand that timely support is important for your family. While we do our best to offer services as soon as possible, predicting exact wait times can be challenging—many clients continue working with their clinician until their goals are met.

What Affects Wait Times?

1. Individual Clinician Waitlists

- Our team consists of four clinicians, each with their own area of expertise and geographic coverage.
- Each clinician manages their own waitlist.
- Please review the clinician profiles below for more information on locations and areas of practice.

2. After-School Availability

- After-school appointments are the most requested and have the longest wait times—often between 8 months to 1 year.
- Many families choose daytime sessions, sometimes pulling their child from school for therapy, to access services sooner.

3. Flexibility in Scheduling

- If you're flexible with your session time (e.g., open to daytime hours) or the mode of service (in-person or virtual), you may be able to start sooner.
